# I am planning to start college in September, what happens if Covid 19 is still an issue?

Your health and safety is of paramount importance, and we are reviewing and following government guidelines for schools and Colleges. This includes social distancing measures and we will continue to follow the guidance as we move into the new academic year.

Rest assured, you will start your course in September with BTC and we will keep in touch with you over the summer.

# What are the social distancing measures that you will have in place for September?

We are working to ensure we keep you safe at all three campuses so will be implementing a range of measures. These will include reduced group sizes, staggered timetables, one-way corridors systems, hand sanitizing stations, a zoned system and staggered attendance.

# If I need additional support, how will you support me if I'm learning at home due to Covid-19?

As you can imagine, this is a new situation but our dedicated Learning Support team and your tutor will put things in place to ensure you're able to study at home.

### What happens if I don't get my predicted GCSEs?

The important thing to remember is not to panic. Once you have your results, please call a supportive member of our Information, Advice & Guidance team on 01278 441234. There are a number of alternatives that they'll be happy to explore with you.

# If I get better grades than expected in my GCSE's, can I change from a Level 2 to a Level 3?

In most cases yes, but some courses such as plumbing and professional cookery need you to start at Level 2 to develop your skills. Once you receive your results, please get in touch to discuss your options.





### **START OF TERM**

### What day will I start?

The first day of the academic year will be Monday 7 September.

Different courses will start on different days to ensure social distancing. You will be emailed all the information prior to starting.

Please ensure your email is correct and that you check it regularly.

### How can I prepare for my subject?

You will receive a welcome pack in the summer term which may include suggested reading or a project to complete (depending on your course), but just reading around your chosen subject will be useful.

### Will I get my timetable and kit list before I start?

If you have applied for a course starting this September, you will be emailed all the information you need for your first day at College, details about your course, kit list, travel details and your timetable.

Please ensure your email is correct and that you check it regularly.

### I would like to change my course, what should I do?

Please email our admissions team at admissions@btc.ac.uk to let them know which course you'd like to change to. You may need to chat to a tutor if it's a different subject completely, or it could be as simple as changing your record and you'll receive start of year information from the new course team.



# Do you have many students in Year 13 joining the College?

Yes, we often have students join us. Sometimes they've come from a different college or moved to the area.

# Will there be a chance to meet others doing the same course before the first day?

Due to the Covid-19 rules, if you have applied to start this September, you will be invited to an online welcome event during the summer term where you will be given all the information you need before starting the academic year and meet your classmates virtually.

### Do you have uniforms or can I wear anything I want?

There are no uniforms but some departments have branded clothing such as sport and automotive and Protective Personal Equipment (PPE) is expected to be worn in most workshops. You will be issued a lanyard which you must wear on campus for security reasons. It also gives you access to certain areas and you can use it to pay at food outlets.

### THE COLLEGE DAY

# Are there breaks during the day and can I leave the campus?

Breaks are usually 15 minutes in the morning and afternoon, with an hour for lunch. There are no bells and you are welcome to leave the campus, but you will be expected to be in the right place at the right time. If you have enough time, you could make use of the College gym or other facilities during your breaks.

### What catering facilities do you have?

We have a wide range of catering outlets on each campus including a restaurant where you can get hot meals and snacks, coffee shops selling sandwiches and cakes etc. We also cater for vegans, vegetarians etc

### How do the courses and timetables work?

If you've chosen a full-time course rather than an Apprenticeship, you will be expected to attend College on certain days of the week. Apprenticeships work differently – you could be at work all week and only come into College one day a week, or you could spend a few weeks at College then work full-time, or never come in to College and learn everything on the job (including being assessed at work by a College Assessor).

If you are at College, on a typical day, lessons start at 9am (9.30am at Cannington to allow for travel) and finish by 4pm with breaks for lunch.

# If I study a full-time course how many hours will I have to be in College each week?

It varies per course and your timetable will be issued and discussed at your online welcome day. The timetable will be set, so if you have other commitments, you should be able to arrange things around the time you need to be at College.



### I really love sport, are there clubs I can join?

There is plenty to get involved in, Team BTC is our over-arching term for our Sports Academy programme and is open to all students, regardless of their course or campus. We have a number of high-quality teams with students regularly training to compete. These include football (men's and women's), rugby (men's and women's), hockey (men's and women's), netball, golf, basketball and trampolining.

However, don't worry if you play a sport outside of these at a competitive level. Whilst we don't complete weekly training in all sports, we will still ensure all students have the opportunity to represent the College at regional and national competitions such as badminton, cricket, tennis, squash, athletics, table-tennis, swimming and many more.

We have a number of clubs and societies designed to enhance your studies as well as your leisure time. For example, Cannington has its own Young Farmers' Club (YFC), and we have a coding club, an engineering club and a driving club – all of which develop your skills and enhance your employability.

### **APPRENTICESHIPS**

# I've applied for an apprenticeship but haven't found an employer, what should I do?

Don't worry, you will be offered a place on a full-time study programme until you are able to secure an employer. In the meantime, on a full-time study programme, you will be learning the valuable skills an employer is looking for which will help you find an apprenticeship.

# I'm starting an apprenticeship, when will I be expected in College?

That depends on the Apprenticeship. Some are one day a week, others don't expect you to attend College at all, and you're taught and assessed in the workplace. Some are 'block release' which means you spend several weeks or months at College full-time, then the rest of the year working.

Your starter pack at the beginning of term will have all the details.

### How will the T Levels industry placements work?

The T Level is going ahead as expected and we're working with employers to ensure we have the industry placements ready. As you can imagine in the current climate, there will be some changes but each setting will be risk assessed and safe. You may start the year at College full-time and your placement moves to the spring and summer term, so there's flexibility built in to the course.

All three T Levels will start this September as planned, but the industry placement may move to later in the year when businesses have resumed their activities.
