


























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Our partners





The National College for Nuclear (NCfN)



The UK is entering a new stage in its nuclear history.

Worldwide investment in new nuclear is set to hit a staggering £930 billion across the next 20 years, with 12 new reactors planned for the UK alone – the first at Hinkley Point in Somerset and Oldbury in South Gloucestershire.

Add to this a growing decommissioning portfolio, plus the delivery of the Successor class nuclear deterrent, and the result is a huge surge of nuclear investment that will create thousands of jobs, drive regional growth and build the UK's supply chain capability.

The National College for Nuclear is a partnership between education, industry, national regulators and training providers and is revolutionising the way training for the nuclear sector is delivered. The College is designing and developing the UK's nuclear curriculum; delivering industry-trusted qualifications to meet the demand for highly skilled workers in the nuclear sector.

Using cutting-edge technology and virtual reality simulators to replicate the nuclear environment, students work on 'live' projects related to nuclear disciplines. The experience they gain from being totally immersed in practical assignments gives them a far greater understanding of the subject matter than classroom-based learning alone could ever do. By enabling students to see, do and understand, NCfN produces technical professionals who are already 'up to speed' with industry processes, behaviours and protocols, and therefore highly employable within the sector. 


Locations



Fantastic facilities

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Whatever you choose to study with us, you'll have access to fantastic facilities to enrich vour studies and make the most of your time on campus.

Learning Resource Centres

As a Higher Education (HE) student, you will have access to Learning Resource Centres at all of the campuses. They provide specialist printed, electronic and audio-visual library resources; access to computing and printing/photocopying facilities; bookable study rooms and various areas for quiet or group work. A team of professionally-trained staff are available to support you with research, referencing, academic writing and other study skills. They provide one-to-one and group training sessions on using the centre and finding high quality academic resources.

IT facilities

Wherever you are at UCS, you'll find it easy to stay in touch with free Wi-Fi across our campuses and plenty of desktop computers for student use, including Apple Macs and PCs. Classroom learning is complemented by our Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) which makes

supplementary materials available online, and robust systems are in place to ensure that learning can be supported on and off campus. Every student is given their own email and Microsoft Teams account, accessible anywhere, any time.

Social areas

We provide all that you need to make the most of your leisure time. University is about learning and challenging yourself academically but it is also about friendship building and making lifelong memories. We provide vibrant common rooms and Students' Union hubs across our campuses giving you ample opportunity to catch up with friends and relax between teaching sessions.

Cafés and shops

We operate professional restaurants along with a variety of coffee bars and cafés such as Costa at each campus. There's even a hair and beauty salon.



Sports facilities

No university environment is complete without its own sports facilities, and UCS doesn't disappoint. Across our campuses, we have a range of facilities including a floodlit 3G FIFA approved artificial pitch, five football pitches, a rugby pitch, sports halls, gymnasiums, sports rehabilitation rooms and a studio cycling facility. We also host a stunning 9-Hole Golf Course in the beautiful Cannington countryside and an Activity Centre to cater for outdoor adventurous activities.

Childcare Centres

We have childcare centres at our Bridgwater and Taunton campuses, meaning you can leave your little ones in safe hands during your time here. The centres also provide a training environment for our students, giving them practical experience of an Early Years setting.

The McMillan Theatre

Drive onto our Bridgwater campus and the first thing you'll notice is our multi-million pound creative arts centre – The McMillan Theatre. With seating for 350 people and state-of-the-art facilities for streaming events, the theatre is one of the largest in the local area, and hosts a full programme of shows from stand-up comedy and pantomime to plays and concerts.

The Walled Gardens of Cannington

The Walled Gardens of Cannington are set within the grounds of a medieval priory and many of its fine buildings, including the walls of the garden, remain. They are accredited as a 'quality assured visitor attraction' by VisitEngland, and a Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) recommended garden.

Equestrian Centre

The Equestrian Centre at our Cannington campus is an approved British Horse Society (BHS) riding school. Private and group lessons are available for riders of all abilities and it has indoor and outdoor arenas, two large stable blocks and a variety of well-schooled horses.

A place to call home

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For many undergraduate students, living away from home is an essential part of the university experience. University Centre Somerset offers accommodation in Cannington and Taunton providing a welcoming place to live where you can form friendships and stand on your own two feet. You are welcome to come for a personal tour of the accommodation whenever you wish, just contact the Residential Team.

Halls of Residence

Cannington Halls are located in the picturesque village of Cannington. All rooms are single occupancy, with catered and self-catering rooms available. Here, you'll become part of a vibrant residential community where people share interests and a love for the beautiful countryside that is right on the doorstep. Facilities include free Wi-Fi, common room, bar, restaurants and cafés, free on-site parking and a launderette. The accommodation is overseen by the 24-hour Residential Team, who put on activities for students, most of which are free to take part.

Taunton Student Flats

Recently refurbished, the accommodation is only a 5 minute walk from the Taunton Campus, and a 10 minute walk into Taunton town centre. The accommodation is comprised of shared flats within a charming listed building. The flats are likely to be popular, so please let us know as soon as you can if you would like to reserve accommodation for September 2023. Living out

For students who are looking to live in shared accommodation, or to rent a room in a private house, there are local estate agents who can help. These are not managed by University Centre Somerset, and students are responsible for agreeing terms with landlords.

Accommodation costs

Fees vary depending on your choice of accommodation. You should budget a maximum of £150 per week to stay in halls, based on a 34 week year. Rental fees include all bills and personal possessions insurance. Students living in halls of residence do not pay council tax. However, they will need to purchase a TV licence if they have a television in their bedroom.

Heart of the South West



For many, the South West is associated with holidays and leisure time; a place of character and charm, of quaint villages and stunning scenery; a place where time passes slowly. Whilst that is true, the region is also an area of growth, with vibrant, flourishing local industries including nuclear energy, science and engineering, media and creative industries, and professional services.

As a result, Somerset is an exciting county to live and study in.

Boasting no less than three Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) and 40 miles of coastline offering everything from goldensand beaches to soaring cliffs and serene wetlands, it's a place of opportunity and ambition which hasn't lost its rural appeal in the pursuit of economic growth.

Taunton

Our county town, Taunton, has a mix of shops, bars and restaurants, and great leisure facilities. It is an attractive garden town, with a vibrant local culture and easy access to wonderful countryside and buzzing cities. Bristol and Exeter are within easy reach, while the delights of Exmoor and the Devon, Dorset and Somerset coastlines are also a short hop away in the car, or by bus or train. Sport lovers are well catered for here, with Somerset County Cricket Club located in the heart of town, and the Premiership rugby clubs of Exeter, Bath and Bristol all within easy reach.

Bridgwater

Home to the largest illuminated carnival in Europe, Bridgwater is a close-knit community with bags of history and character. The town hosts a selection of shops and cafés, and provides easy access to cities like Bath, Wells, Bristol, Exeter and Cardiff. It is only a short distance to the mystical splendour of Glastonbury, famous for the music festival, while the tranquil Somerset Levels and Quantock Hills are quite literally on the doorstep. Local sports clubs offer opportunities to play rugby, football, netball, hockey, tennis and even good old-fashioned West Country skittles.

Cannington

Cannington is located on the edge of the Quantock Hills, just a short journey from Bridgwater and Taunton. Because of its rural setting, the campus is relatively self-contained, offering plenty of activities to keep students busy. Although it is a relatively small village, Cannington's amenities include pubs, restaurants and shops. The biggest appeal here though is the breath-taking surrounding scenery and sense of rural charm. Students at Cannington are usually drawn here by a love of the countryside, and the campus provides a perfect place from which to find new ways of enjoying the great outdoors.

Entry requirements

In order to study a Higher Education course you need to have completed a full Level 3 qualification such as A Levels, vocational studies or an Apprenticeship, and Level 2 qualifications such as GCSEs or a recognised equivalent qualification. Some courses will require specific subjects and, in some cases, we may ask for specific grades in these subjects.

Entry requirements for the majority of our courses are expressed in UCAS Tariff Points. Tariff Points can be found on the course pages and the website however we recommend that you use the online UCAS Tariff Calculator.

Whichever course you choose to study, you will be expected to demonstrate the skills necessary to fulfil the demands of the course, including an understanding of written English and basic maths. We generally ask for four GCSEs, or equivalent, at Grade 4 or above, to include English

language and maths. Creative Arts courses require English, while maths is desirable but not necessary. We accept any combination of old and new GCSE grades and recognised equivalent subjects such as Functional Skills. Applicants with English as their second language must have a minimum IELTS Level 6 or equivalent.

Mature students who do not meet these formal entry requirements are welcome to apply if they can evidence their interest, relevant experience and knowledge in the field of study. A formal interview will be required. If an applicant has been out of education for more than five years an Access to Higher Education Diploma, or similar, in a relevant subject may be required. Please use the UCAS Tariff Points Calculator to identify your predicted grades at www.ucas.com/ucas/tariff-calculator. or speak to the Admissions Team to discuss your application in more detail.

TIP - A good personal statement is relevant and focused (4,000 characters)

HOW TO APPLY Full-time study

If you intend to study full-time for your degree, you must apply for your place at University Centre Somerset through UCAS, using the website www.ucas.com.

For entry in September 2023 you can submit your application any time from 1 October 2022. However, we would advise you to submit your application as soon as possible to maximise your chances of securing a place and, where possible, before the UCAS equal consideration deadline in January 2023.

Personal statements

The personal statement is an important part of your application. It is your opportunity to tell us about yourself, what motivates you, your ambitions, any transferable skills you have, your experiences and how they will help you to achieve your goal. The personal statement must be yours but please seek advice from your tutors and careers teams who will steer you in the right direction. More details on personal statements can be found at www.ucas.com/personalstatement.

When your application arrives at UCAS

Once you are happy with your application, you have paid the fee and submitted it to UCAS, you cannot change your personal statement nor can your referee change your reference. UCAS will send your application to your chosen universities or colleges. UCAS will advise you to use UCAS TRACK, which will enable you to view the status of your application online at any time. We will also contact you via email at each stage of your application, including your invitation to interview, your offer and details regarding induction and enrolment.

Interviews

For many of our courses, applicants will be invited to interview, where you will need to display the relevant skills and enthusiasm for the course and we will confirm your suitability to study on your chosen course.

For art-based subjects, you will be expected to submit a portfolio displaying pieces of your original work along with evidence of drawing ability and creativity, please be prepared to talk about these at your interview.

Please note that entry to some of our programmes is subject to a satisfactory Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check.

Please check individual course pages for information about additional interview requirements.

Open events

Attending an open event provides you with an excellent opportunity to get a sense of studying at UCS. Our staff, will be available to answer any questions you may have regarding university life and your application. Check the website for event dates.



Fees & finance

University Centre Somerset prides itself on offering top quality Higher Education at a lower cost than other universities, without diminishing quality.

We offer the chance to earn a qualification awarded by a top university or training provider while enjoying the many benefits of studying at our campuses. Funding your future


While it can seem a big step to take on a student loan, the system is set up to the advantage of students. That explains why the number of undergraduates enrolling at UK universities has risen since the introduction of the current fee

structure: it is now easier than ever to study for a degree, without taking on any up-front costs.

Repayment

It's important to remember that you won't have to repay any of your student loan until you earn at least the earnings threshold set by Student Finance England. If your earnings subsequently drop below the threshold, your loan repayments stop. Check the Student Finance England website for the latest information on income thresholds and repayments.

Diploma is designed to provide a
route for learners aged 19 or over
who possess few or no formal
qualifications to progress to
university-level study. It can lead to

Teaching & Assessment

The majority of modules are taught via lectures; other teaching methods include seminars, tutorials, workshops and guided learning/independent activities. The Access to HE course utilises a blended learning approach, and some sessions will be delivered online.

Where does it lead?

Successful completion of this course will provide you with a qualification that will allow you to apply to study a university-level course. In recent years, students have gone on to study a wide range of subjects including Biomedical Science at UWE Bristol, Occupation Therapy at the University of Plymouth, Social Work at the University of Bath and Nursing, right here at University Centre Somerset.

Entry requirements:

Whilst there are no specific academic entry requirements, candidates will need a sound grasp of basic skills in English and maths. Given the course is an intensive and demanding one-year programme, students will require determination and resilience, and evidence of this will be asked for at interview.


You are required to be aged 19 or over and may be eligible for a loan to cover your course fees.



If you complete an Access to HE course and then go on and complete a degree or other recognised higher education course, you will not have to repay the remaining loan for the Access to HE course.

Higher & Degree Level Apprenticeships

With the introduction of the Apprenticeship Levy in April 2017, employers are offering more Apprenticeships at higher levels. Our expertise and partnerships with industry enable us to facilitate opportunities that address the increasing demand for higherlevel skills in Somerset and beyond. Higher and degree level Apprenticeships are a popular choice and provide you with the chance to gain applicable skills and knowledge about an industry. Please see our list of courses opposite, check our website or call for more information on the types of Apprenticeships we offer and our employer partners.

What is an Apprenticeship?

Apprenticeships are an effective way of studying, enabling you to gain a nationally recognised qualification whilst obtaining practical on-the-job experience. In our recent Ofsted inspection our Apprenticeship provision was rated Outstanding with Ofsted

inspectors stating that "Apprentices develop an extensive range of skills and knowledge and many extend and deepen specialist skills beyond the requirements of their qualifications."

Higher Apprenticeships refers to Apprenticeships that may include the achievement of academic/vocational qualifications at Level 4 and 5 such as HNCs, HNDs and Foundation Degrees, while degree level Apprenticeships can provide qualifications up to Level 6 or 7, such as a full BA, BSc or BEng Honours Degree, or in some cases even a Masters Degree.

Increasingly, you may hear
Apprenticeships referred to as
standards. These were introduced by
the government as part of ongoing
Apprenticeship reforms to meet the
needs of employers. Standards are
occupation-focused, they are not
qualification-led and the content is
decided by each employer, depending
on their business requirements.

Why choose an Apprenticeship?

They are a great option for anyone looking for a fast track into a career. A Higher or Degree Level Apprenticeship brings together the best of higher and vocational training and enables higher education study plus invaluable on-the-iob training without having to cover the cost of tuition. Fees for Apprenticeships are subsidised by employers and the government, and a salary is then paid to the individual undertaking the Apprenticeship programme - meaning that doing a Degree Apprenticeship can leave you debt-free and provide you with many years' industry experience.

What can I study on an Apprenticeship?

Today you can study anything from human resources to mechanical engineering, health & social care to cyber security, and much more. We have more than 20 on offer and are continually updating our portfolio to support industry demand.

How long is an Apprenticeship?

A Higher Apprenticeship will likely last as long as 3 years, while a Degree Apprenticeship could take as long as 4 to 6 years. As an apprentice, you would be employed full-time, although the combination of work and study can vary from one employer to another. Generally, you'll be required to work 30 hours per week, to leave you time to study, but that could take one of several forms - options include:

- Day release Studying at UCS one day per week
- Block learning Studying for 1-2 weeks at a time
- Blended Learning
 A mixture of online learning and traditional face-to-face

Full-time education

For some employers apprentices will study full-time for the first year of their Apprenticeship, working with the employer during UCS holidays, and starting full-time employment after that first year.




